INTAKE & ADOPTIONS

In 2015, Manitoba Underdogs brought 191 dogs and 8 cats into our care. Most of these animals were rescued from remote communities across Manitoba, with many also coming in as owner surrenders. We successfully adopted out 198 animals.



ADOPTION PROMOTIONS

Occasionally we run adoption sales to help promote certain adoptables. In 2015, we ran the following promotions:

ADOPTION EVENTS

MUR attended several adoption events coordinated by supporters. A few included Pet Valu, Sunova Credit Union and the Winnipeg Pet Show.

MUR did not host many stand-alone adoption events in 2015. This decision was made after reviewing the interest and attendance in past adoption events.

We felt that these events were not a good use of our resources and volunteer's time. Instead, we focused on reviewing our adoptables coordination (ensuring dogs were photographed in a timely manner, personality bios for dogs were more accurate and reflected their needs better). We also began featuring adoptables regularly on our Facebook and Instagram pages.



INTAKE HIGHLIGHTS

In 2015, we participated in several rescue intake missions. Most notably was our rescue just before our team holidays mid-December. We were notified about five dogs in Norway House First Nation, four of them a bonded pack and one a mother dog with a single surviving newborn puppy that was born in a tire. The bonded pack included **Finley** (who was referred to as One Eye in NH due to one blue eye), **Apollo** (who suffered a fracture in a front leg due to a bullet), **Atlas** (an abandoned 10 year old) and **Norman**. **Niska** was the mother dog who gave birth to her babies in a tire; sadly, only **Ronon** survived the harsh elements of winter up North.



MEMORABLE ADOPTIONS



Azariah was surrendered to our care after her previous owner suffered a heart attack and could no longer physically care for her. Azariah was a special girl to MUR - she was our first hearing and visually impaired dog, with sight in only one eye. Luckily, her owner did love her and she was familiar with several hand signals for basic commands.

This pretty girl found a loving home with two older kids outside of the city. She transitioned perfectly, but we guess that is how it goes when it's a perfect match! Our popular little guy **Percy**! This small puppy came to us after he was blinded with hair dye up in a northern community. Both eyes had a blue fog-like cover to them, and he was in pain. He was treated for five months in foster care, and one eye had greatly improved. Unfortunately, the other eye continued to be a problem and Percy was beginning to become intolerant of being handled and having his daily eye-drops administered to help the eye recovery. The decison was made to enucleate the eye so that he could move on with his life, and have no long-term health problems directly related to his eye.

In August, Percy's foster mom and trainer decided he fit in just a little too well in her home and she officially foster failed with him. He now has several furry siblings now that he happily lives with, including a kitty sibling who is also one-eyed!

FIX IT! MANITOBA


Part of our mandate at MUR is to help control the animal population in a humane, animal friendly manner. To accomplish this, our Fix It! program will:

- Support and host information sessions and events to create awareness about the benefits of controlling the animal population of Manitoba;
- Run spay and neuter clinics in high risk Manitoba communities and provide subsidized services for low income households;
- Partner with provincial initiatives that aim to address pet overpopulation through mobile spay/neuter clinics.



In 2015, we held two mobile (Brokenhead & Sandy Bay First Nations) and one "Beat the Heat" style (also Brokenhead First Nation) spay/neuter clinics, fixing a total of 43 dog which prevents approximately 500 puppies from being born in Manitoba.

Our mobile clinics are made possible thanks to **Hudson Reykdal Veterinary Services**. We travel with them to First Nations communities to provide spay/neuter, vaccines, other necessary veterinary needs and education to these communities.



"Beat the Heat" initiatives are smaller scale spay/neuter clinics we hold with local vets in Winnipeg. In 2015, we did this with Southglen Veterinary Hospital. A specific date was set aside for 10 dogs to come into the city from a First Nations community (transported by volunteers), spayed, and returned the following day to their owners.



WONDERDOGS

Our Wonderdogs program aides in soliciting donations for and promoting animals in our care who are overcoming illness and injury, or mental/emotional challenges. We have had 74 Wonderdogs inducted into this program over the years since opening our doors, 23 of which were from 2015. Sadly, we lost 7 to their individual battles, despite our best efforts: Vinnie, Solo, Cadence, Opus, Odessa & Gwen and Oreo. You will forever live in our hearts!

MARKETING & COMMUNICATIONS

In June 2015, Sunova Credit Union hosted their 10th annual golf tournament in support of MUR and raised \$26,000. The funds they raised were for the sole purpose of purchasing a vehicle for our organization that would make transporting animals, including making many emergency trips to and from northern communities. The van was deemed the Sunova Canine Cruiser! Not only does this branded van offering advertising for Sunova, it creates a public image for MUR and makes us recognizable on community outreach missions.



Facebook remains our primary social media platform; having grown from 4,184 followers on January 1st to 6,758 followers on December 31st. We averaged 4,983 people reached per post in January; decreasing to 4,128 people reached by December. This decrease is likely due to the rescue being closed during the last week and a half of December.
