INTAKE & ADOPTIONS



In 2017, Manitoba Underdogs brought 209 dogs and 19 cats into our care. We successfully adopted out 209 dogs and 18 cats.

We had 7 dogs from 2017 adoptions returned throughout the year, and 3 dog returns from previous years. This kept our return rate at a low 3% for the year.

ADOPTION PROMOTIONS

Occasionally we run adoption sales to help promote certain adoptables. In 2017, we held two adult dog adoption sales (\$50 off) and one adoption sale on all ages (\$50 off). We had an additional 10 adoptions from the adoption sales.

ADOPTION EVENTS

MUR attended 15 adoption events in 2017. Some of our hosts included Pet Valu (various locations), Paws for Thought Pet Boutique and Sunova Credit union.

We were extremely lucky this year, and had gorgeous "adopt me" vests sponsored by Sunova Credit Union for our adoptables to wear at our events so that they stand out from the crowd!



INTAKE HIGHLIGHTS

Each dog who comes into our care has their own unique story. These are just three of 209 stories from 2017!

GINGIN (left) was in rough shape. She was heavily pregnant, and scarred, from defending herself and puppies from her previous litters, from other dogs. During a spay/neuter clinic, she was surrendered to our care by her owner. She wound up giving birth to twelve healthy puppies in the middle of the clinic! Sadly, GinGin also tested positive for Heartworm disease, which is fatal if not treated. She has made it through her treatment, and is recovering now. She looks like a completely different dog now that she is healthy, shiny, and no longer skinny.

SMUDGE (middle) was brought into our care by our friends at The Ark Project. He was unable to walk, was covered from head to toe in ticks, had an ear that split in half, and a split tooth. As if it couldn't get any worse, he also tested positive for both Heartworm and Lyme disease. Diagnostics showed that Smudge was suffering from severe vertebral collapse and compression on the cervical spinal cord. These results were devastating to not only our team, but to his amazing foster family. Smudge's surgical options were limited, and his prognosis for recovery and a life with any quality was minimal. Heartbreakingly, the decision was made to allow Smudge to be free of the suffering he had endured for so long before he came to us. On his last day, he enjoyed a delicious teriyaki pork loin, a trip to the park for hamburgers and ice cream, and a rest in the cool, long grass. Later that evening, we said our goodbyes. With a heart full of love and a belly full of his favourite meals, Smudge peacefully began is journey at Rainbow Bridge.

CAYENNE (right) was a stray dog well known in her community. She had no home, and was pregnant every heat cycle she had. Every litter, her puppies didn't make it. Our team attempted to capture Cayenne on four different occasions, and other rescues had made their own attempts as well. In November of 2017, we made a trip out to the community to try again before the deep freezes of winter spurred their ugly heads. Lo and behold, after several hours of attempts, we managed to corner Cayenne under a porch, and crawl in under after her! Much to our surprise, Cayenne was also pregnant. She gave birth to nine healthy puppies on December 8, 2017. Despite years of surviving on her own, Cayenne is doing well and is making huge strides with her confidence!



MEMORABLE ADOPTIONS



SIMBA – WAITED 5 YEARS FOR HIS PERFECT HOME
Simba had a rough go of it. Born in care October 2012 and adopted out as a
puppy, he was returned as an adult, very obese, and with two torn cruciate
ligaments in his back legs, both requiring surgery (something his adopter would not
provide him). After his surgeries and recovery, he found another family, but he was
not happy there and became underweight and riddled with allergies. He was
once again returned.

Simba had been in care with his foster family since November 2016. They did done amazing work with him. He was fit, healthy, and most of all, HAPPY. Finally, in September 2017, we heard the words we had been waiting for because we knew there was no better place for our big boy than with the family he is currently with. Simba's foster family would be adopting him! What they say must be true: third time's a charm.

MEMORABLE ADOPTIONS CONTINUED

KAYA – WAITED OVER 2 YEARS FOR "THE ONE" WHO UNDERSTOOD HER

Kaya originally came into care pregnant in August of 2015. Her litter was born in a wonderful whelping foster home, and once the puppies were old enough to be without their mama, she moved on to a new foster home. Adopted in December, Kaya was returned in February 2016 after an incident with the other dog in the adopter's home. This behaviour was very unlike Kaya, so she was fully assessed by one of our veterinarians. During that exam, it was discovered Kaya had been hit by car at some point, and had broken her hip. Kaya had a femoral head ostectomy performed, and began her healing. This healing didn't go very well in her foster home at the time, so she was moved to a newer, no-dog foster home, Kayla (our spay/neuter and Fix It! program manager). Kayla put in over a year of rehabilitation, both behaviourally and medically into Kaya, who has returned to the happy dog that we fell in love with at MUR. Much to our delight, Kayla announced her foster fail with Kaya in December 2017!





SHADY – WAITED 1.5 YEARS FOR THAT SPECIAL FAMILY Shady was brought into care after a spay/neuter clinic in May 2016. Little did we know this beautiful brindle girl with two blue/brown eyes would wait so long for her forever home.

Shady was diagnosed with pyometra when she was first assessed by a vet, which is in an infection in the uterus, and can be deadly for female dogs. Luckily it was caught, and she was able to receive the surgery she needed.

Shady was first adopted in June 2017, but sadly, returned a couple of weeks later. Shady was having difficulty feeling comfortable around new people, and could be reactive to strangers. She was returned to care, and was placed with an experience foster home to help her overcome her issues.

In September 2017, Shady finally found her forever home with an amazing couple who continue to work with her. She is SO happy where she is, and that makes what we do for these dogs so rewarding.

WE TURNED 6 YEARS OLD

We celebrated a bit different in 2017! In previous years, we've had a big party for the dogs at the home of one of our amazing supporters and friends in Anola. This year, we decided to try changing the location, and adding a bit more to the party!

We hosted our Barks & Bags anniversary party at Wooftopia Dog Training & Recreation Centre. We had the following vendors come out and set up booths: Antler World Dog Products, Canadian Animal Blood Bank, Dakota Veterinary Hospital, Inali Creations, Manitoba Animal Actors, McPhillips Animal Hospital, Melange, Pet Valu Transcona, Perfectly Raw, Planet Pup Doggy Bakery, Riel Jewellery, and Wooftopia Dog Training & Recreation Centre.

We also had some entertaining demos by the Wooftopia trainers, and Manitoba Animal Actors. Leanne Lynn Photography set up a photobooth that was donation based, and 92.1 CITI FM was present with lots of prize giveaways.

The wonderful Sunova Credit Union was our event sponsor this year. We had a delicious BBQ lunch with supplies donated by KUB Bakery, WRMG LAW, Canada Safeway, and Lisa Perkovic. And we can't forget the cupcakes from Kaylee and Chloe!



DONATIONS & FUNDRAISING

FIX IT! MANITOBA

Part of our mandate at MUR is to help control the animal population in a humane, animal friendly manner. To accomplish this, our Fix It! program will:

- Support and host information sessions and events to create awareness about the benefits of controlling the animal population of Manitoba;
- Run spay and neuter clinics in high risk Manitoba communities and provide subsidized services for low income households;
- Partner with provincial initiatives that aim to address pet overpopulation through mobile spay/neuter clinics.





In 2017, we held four mobile spay/neuter clinics, fixing a total of 179 dogs which prevents approximately 3,700 puppies from being born in within those four Manitoba communities.

Our mobile clinics are made possible thanks to **Hudson Reykdal Veterinary Services**. We travel with them to First Nations communities to provide spay/neuter, vaccines, other necessary veterinary needs and education to these communities.

"Beat the Heat" initiatives are smaller scale spay/neuter clinics we hold with local vets in Winnipeg. In 2017, we did this with Southglen Veterinary Hospital, Dakota Veterinary Hospital and Pembina Veterinary Hospital. Although our primary focus is not cats, we fixed 18 cats and 5 dogs throughout the year. We hope to increase this number, specifically for dogs, in 2018.
